

Course Overview

This course is part of the English for IT – Basics Learning Collection. It teaches English language in the context of IT and is designed for learners at the A2 (beginner) level. It covers how to use modal verbs to give advice, describe hypothetical bugs, or explain system limitations. Learners progress from A2 to B1, gaining intermediate language skills and preparing for the English for IT B1 GSE 43-49 certification exam.

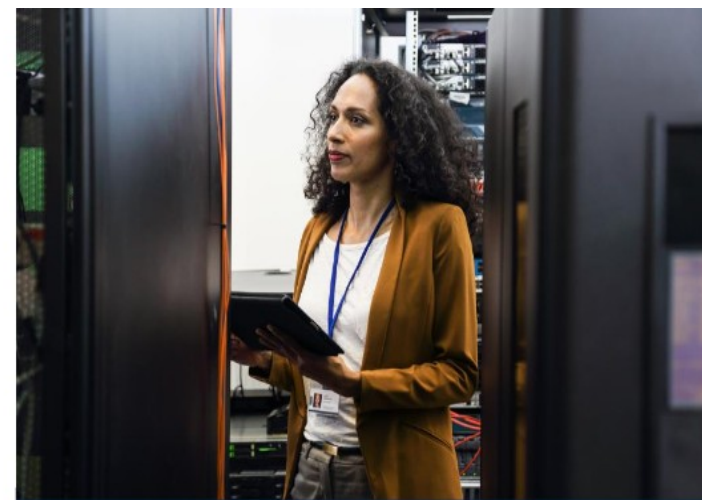

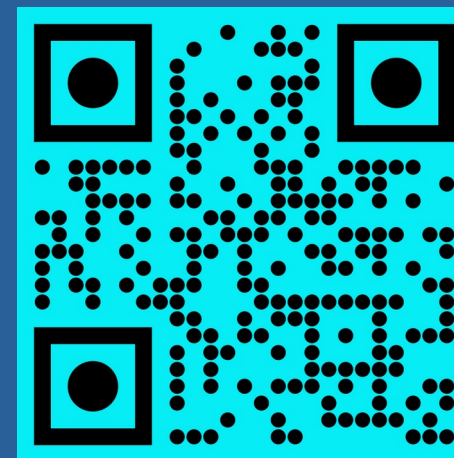
